No specific education or experience is required. Our advocates serve alongside a paid staff member who manages the case. As a CASA, you will learn about the children and what brought them into care, spend time with them, collaborate with others who are supporting them, identify their unmet needs, and submit written reports that are shared with the judge and other parties. Initial and ongoing training is provided. Your monthly time commitment could range from 4 to 12 hours depending on the case. A CASA must be 21 years of age and agree to a criminal and child protection background check.

Join us as we positively impact outcomes for kids. Statistics show that children and youth with a CASA spend less time in foster care, have fewer reentries to the child welfare system, and are more likely to receive the services they need. You can be a consistent, caring presence and ensure their voice is heard. We will show you how. Learn more about CASA by attending a remote information session. 




